Before you click "Submit"

If you're like me, you know <u>"read the prospectus"</u> is good advice. It's not always easy, but it is vital, since every show has its own detailed and often different requirements.

Here are some things to do to make it less likely critical information will be missed. . .

... Take a look at the sponsoring organization's website. If your work is traditional and they support or show mostly contemporary experimental work you're not likely to be a good fit for the event.

...Print out the prospectus and read it with a highlighter in hand. Mark the most critical information as you go along: deadlines, memberships needed, payment options, physical size limits... remember, none of these are optional! Will you have to ship your work? That can be a significant cost. Is there a limit on how old the work is? What about materials? Framing? Can you use Plexiglas? Do you have to be a resident of a certain area?

Almost all shows require digital entries, so you must have good basic photos of the work you want to enter. The digital image size, file name requirements and format absolutely must fit the specifics in the prospectus.

Now, you're ready to really get started on your entry!

• What I do first is make sure my work fits the physical size requirements. For example the "Land

- of Enchantment" entries could be no larger than 30" in height or width, <u>including the frame</u>.
- Then I format the photos of the work I want to enter and name each digital file according to the prospectus' specifications.
- Third, if the show sponsor wants an Artist Statement or bio, I have that file updated with current info and ready to access.
- Last, I open the online application and step-bystep fill in the form... much easier when I've done the prep work outlined above.

Hope these ideas help, and good luck.

Sally Strand's Travel Tips

Getting through airline security with art supplies can be tricky...here are some suggestions:

- Label pastel boxes "Artist Chalks". It is a more easily understood term for the uninitiated security guard trying to hurry travelers through the line. It lessens chances of box being opened and pastels confiscated.
- When traveling with oil paints, refer to them as "Artist Colors" (don't use the term oil paint). Pack them in suitcase with label attached to each bag or containers of paint. It is the "flashpoint" that is the main issue.
