Destination Abstraction

It is hard to find anyone engaged in creative activity who hasn't experienced burnout — those discouraging periods when nothing works and you wonder why you didn't take your father's advice and go to law school. Elizabeth Greenlee, Leila Hall, Jeff Potter, and Fred Yost are a group of PSNM members brought together by a mutual acknowledgment of this debilitating feeling. As they discussed possible solutions to the burnout problem, they discovered they also shared an interest in exploring ways to push beyond their usual representational work toward greater abstraction. They decided to meet every six weeks to share the outcome of their independent efforts on an agreed-upon project and to decide what the next project would be.

In the beginning, they had no intention of exhibiting this work publicly, but have found the collaboration so productive and rewarding they decided other artists might enjoy seeing the results of their efforts. They will show examples of each person's interpretation of various projects at the meeting, as well as explain the process they employed to expand their creative boundaries.

September Program Review

Small Works - Jury of our Peers

If you thought setting up the Small Works Art Show was for cream puff types, think again! First volunteers had to organize a digital entry show, draft a prospectus, arrange for the jury process, and set up a calendar to coincide with PSNM's National Show, without conflicts or confusing prospective entrants.

Add to the task pre-electronic age artists who thought "not embedded" was a mistake because who would know the painting's title, or the artist. And PayPal was just too complicated to figure out for some. When was the entry fee to be paid? The Show Chair woman said children and grandchildren of computer illiterates were very helpful and she believed the show promised to be outstanding. The committee had adjusted intensities of colors and had hidden artists' names in the digital images, as some had signed their names prior to photographing their paintings. Perhaps the prospectus for future Small Works Shows will mention that small paintings done on rough textured surfaces look fine until projected on a large screen, where the surfaces appear to be pockmarked and/or covered with white scratches. Those distractions were invisible until the image was enlarged.

The audience viewed all the 126 entries three times on a huge screen. The first viewing was to let us see the scope

of the work. The second was for scoring from (ugh) # 1 to (marvelous, I'm envious) #10 the entries, which were listed by title and number on four sheets of paper. The third viewing was for us to catch any painting we'd missed or correct errors in scoring. The show committee will compile the scores and determine the number of entries for the available space. Email notification of the final results will be sent to all entrants shortly.

The show committee for the first Small Works Show deserves a big hand for undertaking the task and for doing such a great job. May all future Small Works Shows be conducted with the same professionalism.
